### GARDENING FOR JOY

In his last manuscript, "The Dispersion of Seeds," Henry David Thoreau says, "As I went by a pitch-pine wood the other day, I saw a few little ones springing up in the pasture from these seeds which had been blown from the wood. In a few years, if not disturbed, these seedlings will alter the face of Nature here."
